

CHOOL HOLIDAY INFORMATION GUIDE

What does my child need to bring?

- St Margaret's OSHC supports healthy eating. Please support us by making healthy choices when packing your child's lunch.
- Please pack morning and afternoon tea, lunch and a refillable drink bottle. Remember to not pack anything containing nuts or any food that needs to be heated or cooked.
- Please pack your hat, sunscreen and comfortable, appropriate clothes and enclosed shoes. NO HAT, NO SUNSAFE CLOTHING MEANS NO OUTDOOR PLAY! At least one extra set of clothes in a plastic bag must be included in each child's bag for wet weather contingency. Please ensure they are seasonally appropriate.
- Children are encouraged to wear "play clothing" that can get dirty and be subject to wear and tear. Children will be asked to wear aprons when painting etc, but educators cannot be held responsible for spilt paint on clothing.

Other Important Information:

Staff will not be escorting children to extra-curricular activities over the School Holiday period. A late fee of \$10 for the first 10 minutes or part thereof, and \$1 per minute thereafter will apply if your child is collected after the closing time of the centre. Please note this is charged per child.

Use of technology

Children are welcome to bring electronic devices including iPods, iPads, Kindles etc, but OSHC will NOT be held responsible if these are misplaced or broken. Students will be able to use electronic devices between the hours of 8am-9am and 4pm-6pm only. Please discuss this with your child before they arrive.

Illness and Infectious diseases

- St Margaret's OSHC aims to promote the health and safety of all children by providing a safe and hygienic environment. To minimise the spread of "germs", it is essential that all ill children and staff stay at home until well. Anyone with an infectious disease will be required to stay away from the service for the recommended period set out by the Department of Health.
- Parents and guardians who keep their ill children home from care may be eligible for their days at OSHC to be cancelled free of charge, upon presentation of a doctor's certificate. Cancellations of all care must be made in writing to <u>oshc@stmargarets.qld.edu.au</u> as soon as the decision has been made not to send your child to OSHC.


